Scriptural Foundations of Catholic Social Teaching

- Charity AND Justice
- The story of the GoodSamaritan Luke 10:25-37
 - Met immediate needs
 - Private, individual acts
 - Direct service, often repeated
 - Actions directed at symptoms

 The Gospel story does not attempt to survey the causes of highway banditry. Rather the Samaritan provides temporary and immediate relief.



Acting Justly

- What is Justice?
 - River babies
- The Exodus Story Exodus 3:7-12, 7:6-7
 - Moses' Message: "Let my people go."
 - Actions directed at the root cause
 - Public, collective actions
 - Address long-term needs
 - Promotes social change in institutions
 - Resolves structural injustices



How Do We Act Justly?


"Charity will never be true charity unless it takes justice into account ...

We have to move out of our comfort zones. We must study injustices through the lens of Scripture, rather than our own eyes which seek to protect our own interests.

To Love Mercy



- We must first recognize that we have received mercy.
- No one deserves mercy. It is a gift.
- Loving mercy means being willing to act in a loving way, often towards people who we think do not deserve it.
- Loving mercy is a conscious choice, not a feeling.
- We all participate in social sin.

Slave Labor

- Farmworkers
- Hotel/salon workers
- Sex trade
- Racial profiling

Immigration

- Broken immigration system
- Imbalance between economy's demand for low-wage labor and the quota for guest workers



Debunking the Myths

Myth

Immigrants are a drain on the economy.

Immigrants don't pay taxes.

Facts

Without guest workers the economy would lose \$9 billion/yr in agricultural production and 20 % of production would go overseas.

 50-75% undocumented immigrants pay state and federal taxes, Medicare taxes and \$7 billion/yr to the Social Security Fund. They also pay sales and property taxes.

Debunking the Myths

Myth

 Undocumented immigrants are a burden on the U.S. Healthcare system.

Immigrants take jobs away from American citizens.

Fact

- Government spends \$1.1 billion/yr (\$11 in taxes per US household) on healthcare for undocumented immigrants, aged 18-64. They spent \$88 billion on health care for non-elderly U.S. adults in 2000.
- The # of American low wage earners is declining though the economy still needs them. Immigrants are offsetting that decline.

The Church's Position Love Mercy

- Why get involved?
- The Holy Family were migrants too. What if they had not been welcomed in Egypt?
 - Marginalization of immigrants, loss of dignity
 - Family separation
 - Essential jobs unfilled without immigrant labor
 - Deaths due to poor border enforcement



The Church's Position Love Mercy

- We do not condone unlawful immigration
- We advocate for comprehensive immigration reform that
 - Provides sufficient guest worker visas to meet demand
 - Increases the number of lawful visas for relatives to eliminate family separations of 20 years or more
