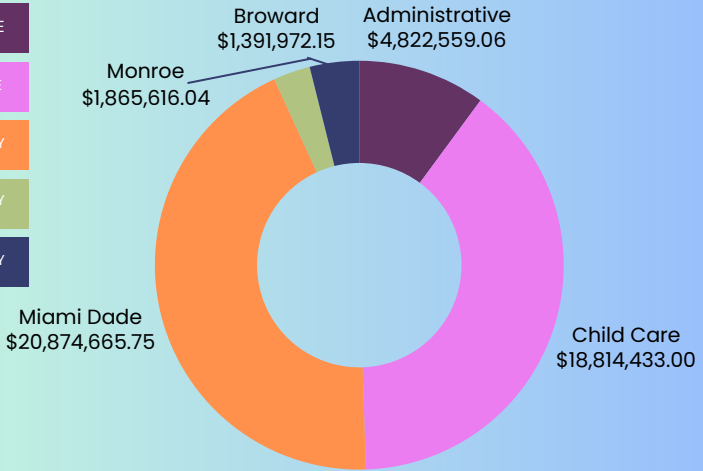

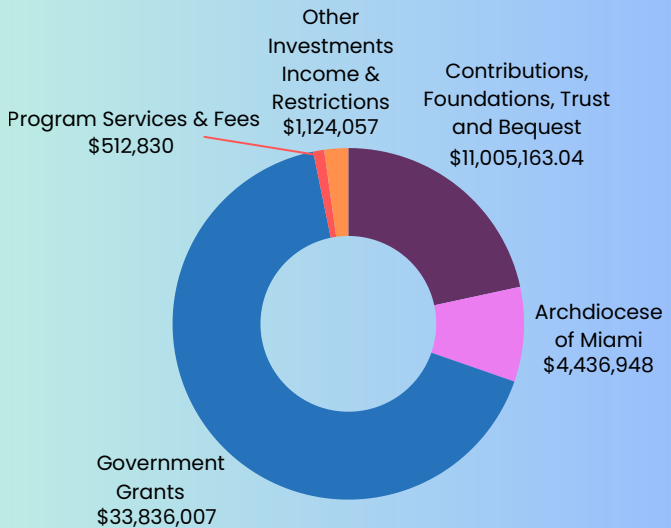

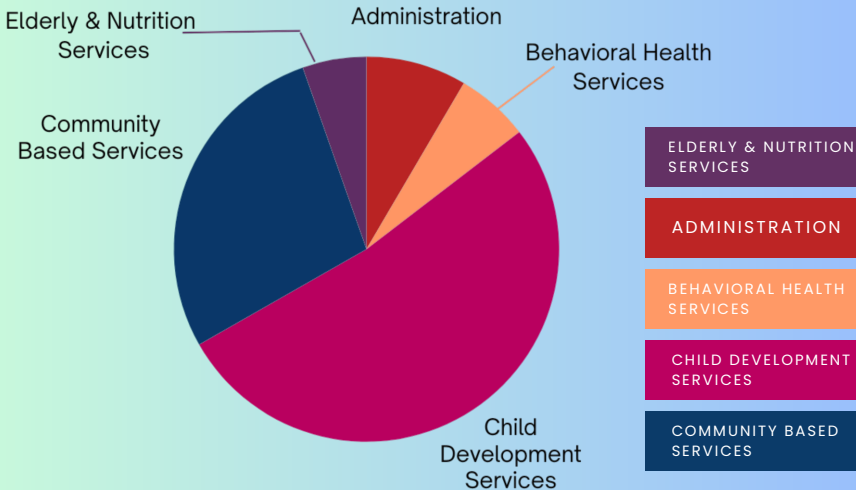
Our Staff

Catholic Charities upholds rigorous service standards to guarantee the excellence of our service delivery. Our agency is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA). Additionally, our six Child Development Centers have received accreditation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and have been awarded the "Gold Seal Quality Care" designation.

Behavioral Health Services

St. Luke's Addiction Recovery & Counseling Program is a comprehensive substance abuse treatment facility providing inpatient and outpatient treatment services. Our dedicated counselors also provide individual, couples, and family therapy.

Elderly Services

Services for the Elderly operates across six (6) locations throughout Miami-Dade County, providing nutritious meals, social and physical activities, and enrichment to seniors.

Adult Day Care provides services to seniors living independently and with loved ones by providing an environment where they can socialize with other seniors and receive case management services appropriate to their individual needs.

Child Development Services

Our **Child Development Programs** offer early childhood education to children ages 0-5. With six (6) centers located throughout Miami-Dade County, we ensure families have access to safe, nurturing learning environments close to home. Our families are also provided with support through Case Management Services.

Disaster Relief Services

Disaster Relief Services are provided to both International and domestic victims of natural disaster or tragic events. International Relief Efforts include Bahamas, Cuba, and Haiti.

Humanitarian efforts include working with partner agencies to provide services to newly arrived immigrants.

Food Pantry Services

Matthew 25 Food Pantry provides supplemental food assistance to individuals and families in need by distributing nutritious groceries and some essential items, helping to ease food insecurity and strengthen the well-being of the community.

Immigrant and Refugee Services

Refugee Resettlement provides case management to entrants. **Children's Village - Boystown** serves minors ages 0-17 years old, offering specialized shelter services. The **Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program** is a unique foster care program that serves dependents who are alone in the US and have an unaccompanied refugee minor status.

Family Enrichment Program Services

Family Enrichment Services supports individuals and families through economic assistance, housing stability, and holistic services focused on health and well-being, education, and employment pathways to self-sufficiency.

Housing Services

We operate four (4) housing programs across Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties, expanding access to safe and affordable housing in our community. **Permanent Supportive Housing** provides housing for disabled adults and their families.

St. Bede's Workforce Housing offers affordable housing for working residents of Key West. **Wenski Groves** offers affordable housing for working residents of the City of Miami.

Outreach Services

Social Justice includes responding to the needs of immigrants, human trafficking, racial injustice, the death penalty, violence prevention, and legislative advocacy.

Our Catholic Social Ministries include:

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) provides relief and support to people in need.

Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) is the U.S. Catholic Bishops' domestic anti-poverty program, working to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ by supporting low-income individuals and families.

St. John Bosco Clinic serves the basic primary medical needs of the uninsured and underserved children and adults in Miami-Dade County.

Homeless Prevention Services

Homeless Prevention provides services across three (3) counties, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Monroe. Offering financial assistance and appropriate referrals to individuals and families in the tri-county area to prevent homelessness. Services include rent, mortgage, and utility assistance.

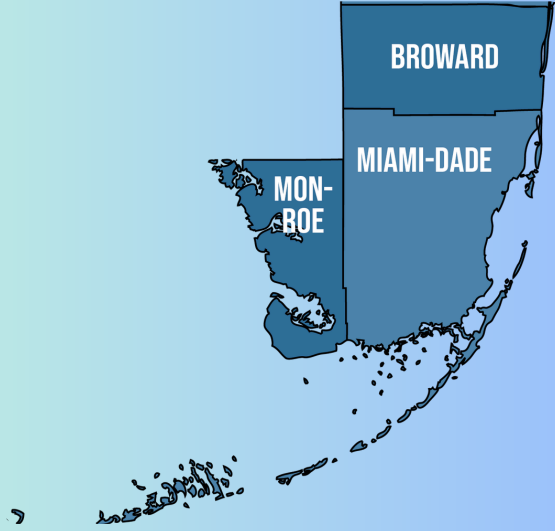
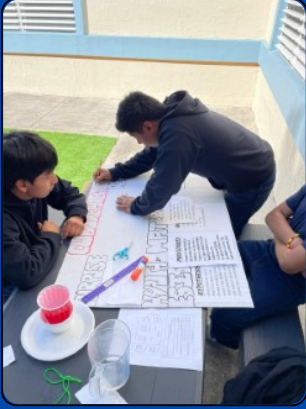


Household Income

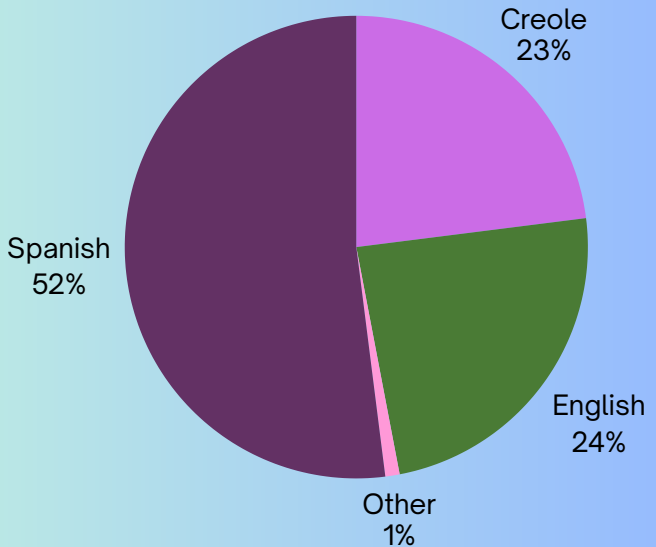
Consumer County Origin



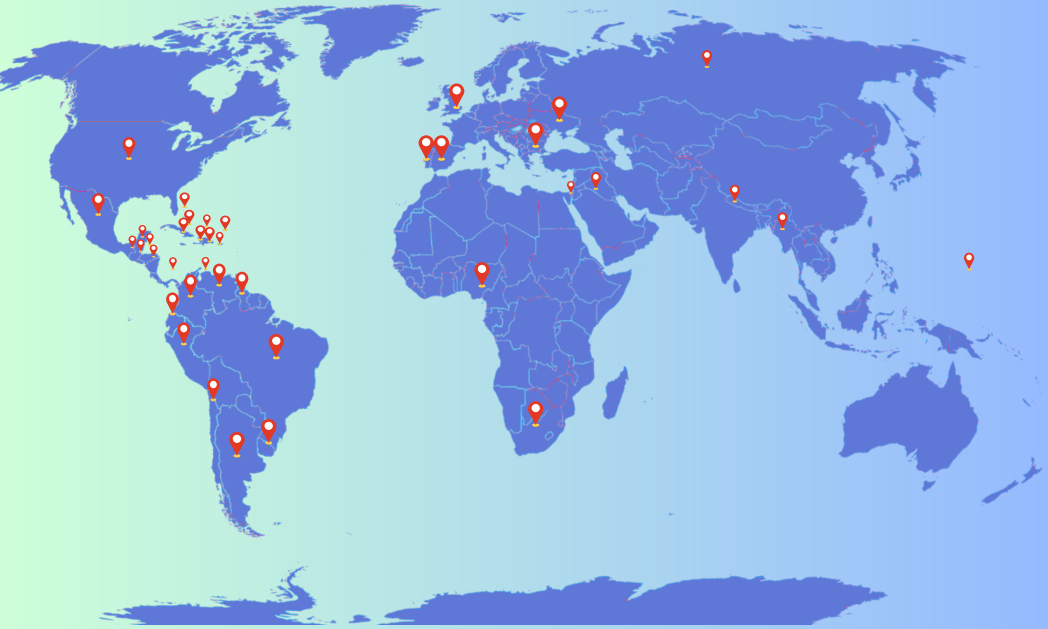

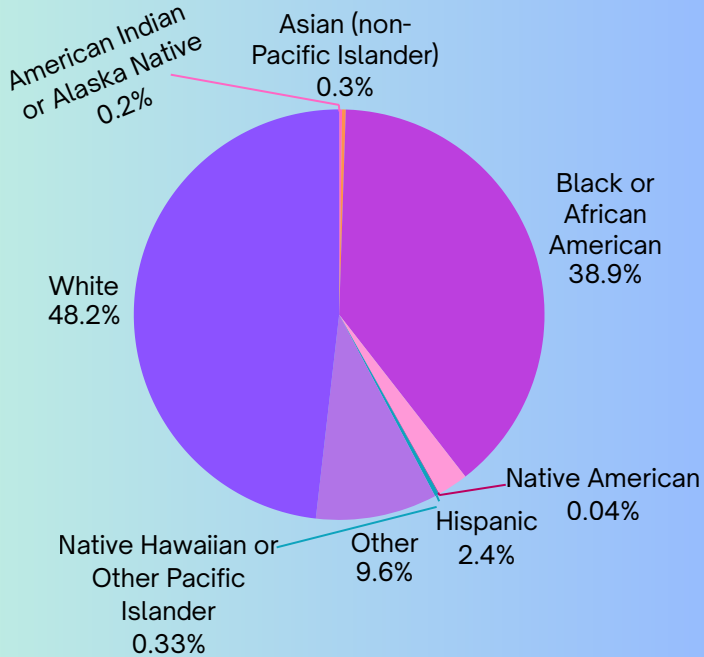

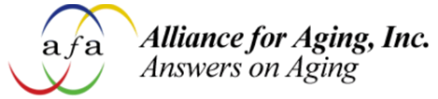
